How to Verify Truth

This world is full of ideas. And some pretty unbelievable ones at that. How can we be sure that what we hear or see is true or real? Let's take a brief walk through history and take a look at some of the ideas that have come and gone through the ages.

Remember when we studied in elementary school that some early societies actually thought that the world was flat? And how it was thought that if you sailed a boat into a sea's horizon, you might actually fall off the edge of the earth? Individuals like Galileo, much to the dismay of the prevailing social, political, and religious authorities, intuited that the earth was not only *not* flat, but it was also not the center of the universe. He did not have the benefit of satellite photographs, but he *did* have the benefit of tapping into the truth within himself of how the solar system was and is structured.

Another idea once considered acceptable was for one human being to be the subject or slave of another. Human beings were simply owned like cattle by a ruling monarchy, a wealthy nobleman, or brutal tyrant. Unbelievably, this still exists in places on our globe. But in 1776, something remarkable happened politically. Thomas Jefferson captured the imagination and hearts of people by penning the famous American Declaration of Independence that stated "we hold these truths to be selfevident, that all men are created equal. That they are endowed by their Creator with certain Unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." Where would such an idea come from? Certainly, it was not circulating as an idea from the British crown. No, it was something wholly different than anything previously imagined by men. It was divine inspiration articulated by a man who had contacted something deep within himself.

When Henry Ford developed the automobile at the beginning of the twentieth century, "experts" of his day warned him and consumers that driving an open carriage automobile at 30 mph would result in suffocation to the driver and passengers. I presume they meant that

the onrushing air would make taking a breath impossible and cause one to suffocate. Henry pursued his ideas and I'm sure the experts all lined up for a ride. In 1895, Lord Kelvin, President of the British Royal Society stated emphatically, "Heavier than air flying machines are impossible." The Wright Brothers in Kitty Hawk displayed otherwise. Charles H. Duell, Director of the U.S. Patent Office prophesied in 1899 that "Everything that can be invented has been invented." Inventors of his era went on and developed their ideas anyway.

There is another idea that has come down and persisted in religious and institutional dogma through the ages. That notion is that man is separate from God and that we must somehow petition, plead, and appeal to God far away somewhere to come and save us from the miserable existence that we find ourselves in. Accordingly, elements within certain religious traditions are eagerly awaiting a messiah to come save the day in a "second coming." Uh-unhh, excuse me, but the "first coming" is still here. "In the beginning was the Word, and Word was with God, and the Word was God....All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made....In him was life; and the life was the light of men... That was the true light which lighteth every man that cometh into the world." (John 1:1,3,4,9) There you have it. Why would God need to come again when God never left? God is expressing as you, me, everyone and everything. God is here and now!

Hasn't this been what enlightened saints and saviors have been saying throughout time? The renowned saint of India affectionately referred to as Babaji (revered Father) has been quoted as asserting "few individuals realize that the kingdom of God fully extends to this realm!" Christ Eshua (Jesus) stated it this way when asked point blank by Pharisees when God was coming. In Luke 17: 20-21 we find, "When some of the Pharisees asked Jesus when the kingdom of God

would come, he answered, saying to them, The kingdom of God does not come by observation. Neither will they say, Behold, it is here! Or, behold, it is there! for behold, the kingdom of God is within you."

So here it is! How can we verify the truth of this or of anything else? This has been the opportunity since time immemorial. And that is to recognize what is already given to us, what is already here. How? We do so by the ancient and contemporary practice of meditation. By directing our attention within, we return to the source of our being and remember who we are at our core. - 1) We must individually and collectively affirm that "We Are One Loving Family Of One Eternal Loving God." Then we must put this spiritual truth into practice in daily life. We will gain more clarity by living this idea than by theorizing about it.
- 2) God must never be used by anyone to control, threaten, discriminate against, or kill any human being anywhere at anytime. We need to stop condoning this abuse of God's name in ourselves, in others, and in organized groups. Let us remove the hypocrisy that it is God's wish.
- 3) We must come to know, in the depths of our being, that we have come from God, we are held in being by God, and ultimately we will be transformed in God. There is no separation from God at any moment of our lives. In other words, we must come to a spiritual understanding of the Divine rather than a religious one. God is our destiny. Divine Love will prevail.


